## Special Services Staffing Feedback

If the model was a k-6 in each district, a 7/8, and a 9-12 (we would have 9 total special educators this way- currently we have 10)

- 1 special educator in each Stew and Canaan
- 3 special educators in Colebrook
- Pittsburg would be 50%
- 1 7/8 special educator
- 2 for 9-12 plus a 50% life skills (we would have about 6 students...at least)

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### SAU wide

- OT we would need one full time and then a day contract
- PT we would need a contract for 1.5 days
- Speech and Language we would need one full time and then a full contract the same as we have now
- special education director 2, 1 VT and 1 NH
- admin assistants, 1 for each state...2 total
- school psych 1 full time for NH students, very small contract for VT (maybe 10 days a year)

\*Things to consider, special ed certifications for states. Special ed teachers should be case managing either NH or VT students, as if they managed IEPs for both states they would have to learn and manage two very different systems.

\* There was a note about would special educators at high school also cover SLP. They would not, as these are very different services and degrees.

\*I noted a 50% for Pittsburg, this is based on current numbers and having the other 50% cover a life skills program is something Jen L and I would both be in agreement with.
